Presenter: Dr. Braun is a licensed psychologist who has been in private practice since 1993. She has been a consultant to early childhood special education settings and worked collaboratively with many school districts. Born in Athens, Greece, Dr. Braun obtained a Bachelor's degree in Special Education and Psychology; Master of Arts in School Psychology, and Doctorate in School Psychology. Dr. Braun completed a child clinical internship at the Alfred I. DuPont Institute in Wilmington, Delaware where she completed rotations in infant assessment, ADHD, head injury, spinal cord injury, and worked with children with chronic illnesses. She has taught undergraduate and graduate level courses in child and adolescent development, psycho-educational assessment and social-emotional assessment at SUNY Albany.

Program: This workshop will provide an overview of various childhood anxiety disorders to include clinical presentation, risk factors, developmental course, and most effective intervention techniques. Case studies will be used to illustrate main concepts and application of techniques. At the conclusion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- 1) Understand and recognize core symptoms/behaviors associated with different childhood anxiety disorders.
- 2) Identify at least 3 risk factors that may predispose children toward anxiety.
- 3) Identify 3 intervention techniques found to be most effective in the treatment of childhood anxiety disorders.
