**Our Speaker:** Pat Schuler, Ph.D., specializes in working with high ability children, especially those who are Twice Exceptional. She has masters' degrees in gifted and counseling psychology, as well as a doctorate in Educational Psychology (Gifted and Talented Education) from The University of Connecticut. Pat is co-author of A Unique Challenge: Sorting Out the Differences Between Giftedness and Asperger's Disorder, an article in the Fall 2009 issue of Gifted Child Today. She's also a co-author of a chapter on gifted students on the Autism Spectrum in the soon to be published A Kaleidoscope of Special Populations in Gifted Education. Pat has a private counseling and educational consulting practice, Creative Insights, in Castleton-on-Hudson, New York.
